JA Inspire® Advanced

► Work and Career Readiness

JA *Inspire* is much more than a career fair. It brings together the business community and local schools and is designed to help launch teens and young adults into their future—postsecondary education and their careers. The curriculum can be completed by participants independently at home, or in a classroom with or without educator involvement. The JA *Inspire* event, which follows the curriculum, can be in-person, virtual, or both.

The learning experience consists of three segments: (1) pre-event career-oriented sessions; (2) the JA *Inspire* event; and (3) a post-event reflection. The JA *Inspire* event is aligned with local industry and career opportunities, as well as local school district preferences.

JA *Inspire* in-person events are multi-hour experiences where participants engage in hands-on activities, often using equipment or tools used on a job. VFairs, the online interactive platform used to host JA *Inspire* virtual events, allows participants to attend webinars and presentations, explore company exhibits, and interact with career speakers. Both event types provide participants a powerful way to learn about real-world career opportunities and their local economy.

This learning experience is part of the JA Work and Career Readiness Pathway and can be placed in Grades 9–12 and post-high school.



LEARNING EXPERIENCE HIGHLIGHTS

- Multiple curriculum implementation options: fully educator-led, fully self-guided, or hybrid with classroom introductions and talking points for all self-guided sessions.
- Allows participants to explore their own values, skills, and interests, plus career clusters and the specific jobs that align with them.
- Requires a digital device for each participant.
- Event (virtual, in-person, or both) provides a powerful way to learn about real-world careers.
- Provides many extension activities via JA Connect® (connect.ja.org/work-career-readiness)

LEARNING EXPERIENCE OBJECTIVES

After participating in the learning experience, students will be able to:

- Gain insight into career clusters that interest them.
- Make connections with adults who have jobs in careers that interest them.
- Recognize traits of their local economy.
- Collect information about the education and training requirements to be successful in a job.
- Practice soft skills.

VFAIRS PLATFORM DETAILS (VIRTUAL EVENT ONLY)

- Is accessible from any device.
- No downloads are required.
- Visually rich virtual environment mimics the dynamics of a physical live event, including a virtual lobby, information desk, auditorium for presentations, and exhibit halls with sponsoring company booths.
- Participants can revisit the virtual JA *Inspire* event multiple times.
- Materials can be saved to a virtual backpack and emailed to participants post event.

JA INSPIRE CURRICULUM

The JA *Inspire* self-guided curriculum's implementation is flexible, based on educator and JA Area preferences. Educators can introduce and follow up activities using the optional wraparound session guides, or participants can complete sessions independently at home or in the classroom. Downloadable, fillable PDF activity pages, videos, and links to websites are accessed through the digital guidebook. Self-guided extended learning resources are identified.

1 Session One: Career Interests and Your Path

Participants understand the importance of career planning and complete a Career Interest Inventory to assess their own values, skills, and interests in the context of career paths.

2 Session Two: Career Planning and Your Path

Using JA Here to Career® at <https://career.ja.org/>, participants learn to recognize career clusters and focus on those tied to the results of their Career Interest Inventory. They explore the knowledge, skills, and abilities needed for their careers of interest, as well as the outlook for openings in those fields.

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3 Session Three: Preparing to Meet Your Future

Participants learn how awareness of their values, skills, and interests helps guide them to a career that is meaningful, enjoyable, and positioned for success. They learn about soft skills and explore education, training, and apprenticeship requirements in their fields of interest.

4 Session Four: Local Business Means Opportunity

Participants learn about their local economy. They review the list of *JA Inspire* exhibitors and the website of their local Chamber of Commerce and look for common themes, such as career clusters. They identify companies they would like to visit during the *JA Inspire* event. They create a brag sheet of their accomplishments.

5 Session Five (Virtual Event): Learn from the Experts

This session is used if participants are attending a virtual JA Inspire event.

Participants review the speakers and webinars at the *JA Inspire* virtual event, create a list of at least three to view, and define what they would like to learn from them.

Session Five (In-Person Event): Prepare for the JA Inspire Event

This session is used if participants are attending an in-person JA Inspire event.

Participants prepare for the in-person *JA Inspire* event by reviewing logistics of the event day and getting ready to make a good first impression when interacting with company representatives.

6 Session Six: Visit the JA Inspire Event

Participants attend the *JA Inspire* event. This may be a virtual event on the vFairs platform, an in-person event, or both.

7 Session Seven: JA Inspire Personal Reflection

Participants reflect on what they have learned and identify next steps to further define their academic choices and career path.
